The rumble of a dump truck motor and grunt of a digger were the background noise as I began writing this article. However, those exposed pipes became a visual which led me to examine myself. Were there leaks in my heart? Were there unaddressed molding places of fear or hopelessness covered over with a pleasant exterior? And, how about my heart's septic system? Was the forgiveness, grace and mercy I'd received properly flushing out all "waste?" Was sludge present? Any raw sewage leaking through? It's not nice to see the wrong within; much easier to overlook or minimize leaks and clogs as part of being human. But like our ceiling, and sewer, they eventually will demand attention. And in the meantime, how contagious is faith when burdened by these?

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Home repairs and heart repairs require intentional, deliberate action. We were very blessed to have contractors we trusted to handle our home repairs. And for heart repairs, thankfully we have an amazingly competent and faithful Contractor God. He specializes in replacing leaking pipes and removing sludge in hearts. When we recognize our sin and ask Him to forgive us, we are promised: "Let the wicked forsake his way and...turn to the Lord, and he will have mercy...and he will freely pardon" (Isa.55:7). How freeing! Sisters, let's throw off everything that hinders and place our trust in our Divine Contractor for each repair. Those glaringly obvious, or ones fermenting under the surface.
