Recently a friend and I reflected on the influence of our grandparents, and now as part of that generation, our desire to follow their lead (Deut. 6:6-7). This prompted me to also reflect on the many godly teachers, mentors, and friends whose faith continues to influence the way I live. I'll share a few:

- High school Bible teacher John's contagious faith. He gave me the desire for a contagious faith too
- Friend Kathy, when she was struggling to discern truth as she faced conflicting interpretations of Scripture. She confidently shared her anchor was the basic truth: "Jesus loves me this I know."
- Book of Romans study, with Pastor Curtis. When reading Romans 7:24-25, "who will rescue me from this body of death," he joyfully emphasized: "Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! We have a Savior!" Also, during that small group Romans study, we listened to a recording of J.C. Wenger. He highlighted the role of the Holy Spirit to convict persons of sin, and of the Spirit having a much more gracious way of convicting than humans.
- Friend and mentor Miriam's illustration of a dish rag. Christians constantly taking in, but not giving out become like a dish rag that's not rung out. Eventually our witness stinks.
- Bible study leader, Zenida, encouraged us to keep a dictionary with our Bible to look up the definition of words that need greater clarity.
- Young adult teacher Henry's challenge at the beginning of a new year to reflect on the previous year and ask: Have you grown in your relationship with God? Can you see a difference? His focus being <u>improvement</u>, and not needing to be significant.

• Counselor Pamela when recommending a book for a situation involving demon oppression, stressed reading God's Word was highest priority. It was more important to be grounded in God's truths than gain information on the subject.

These (and <u>many</u> more!) helped move me beyond an intellectual knowledge of Jesus, to Him being a living reality because I witnessed them living out their faith. So, I offer you a challenge. Look Back. Note what influenced your life. Thank God. Then purpose in heart to share your faith journey; pay it forward.

I wanted to be connected to a church again, so I thought I would give this new BFG a try! It was in this group where I met Adam. Our relationship grew, and we were married

in 2016. We are now parents to Rhett (3) and Silas (1) who bring us great joy! Motherhood has only deepened my awareness of how sinful I am and how much I need Jesus to grow in spiritual maturity.

When I'm not teaching or running around after the boys, I still enjoy playing hockey, reading, baking, drinking iced coffee, and listening to podcasts.
