"...be strong in the Lord, and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God...and after you have done everything, to stand" (Eph. 6:10,13b)

Recently a new truth, from the familiar "Armor of God" passage, connected with an experience of watching a grandson's game. This soccer game was competitive; one they needed to win. They had practiced; were mentally prepared for what they needed to do; put on the outside "armor": uniform, shin pads; outfitted the goalie, full water bottles. Their feet were fit with the readiness of correct footwear, and using their knowledge of the game, they played skillfully. They played hard. They harmoniously worked together as a team; communicated with each other as they played; encouraged each other; stepped up to cover for another when needed. They played well. But in the end, they lost. From this grandmother's perspective, the opposing team didn't show good sportsmanship; didn't play respectfully or fairly, and some issues were left unaddressed by the officials. [As correspondence after the game with league leaders seemed to confirm.] It was disappointing. It was wrong. It hurt. But they won where it counted. They didn't lower their sportsmanship standards; they encouraged each other to keep their cool; they continued to play well in spite of what felt unfair calls. They stood strong. Later, as we discussed the game, including the feelings and emotions that accompany such a game, I affirmed and praised him for his role and how he played in the midst. And, told him a win wasn't what mattered most in the end.

Reminds me of my Heavenly Father. He asks us to prepare by putting on the full "armor," and to be aware of the protection each provides. He asks us to confidently engage, with our confidence in Him, so we can remain strong. To strive for the win. Not every battle will end in a win; not every battle requires a win, but in every battle, what He wants from each of us, is to be able to stand in the end, and strongly, and clearly, testify of His faithfulness.

Father, help us prepare and engage in battle, so after we have done everything, we will be able to stand and testify of Your faithfulness. Amen.
