My priority was to be there for him in the nursing home visiting him as much as I could, taking him to doctor appointments, and spending quality time with him until the very end. Almost to the day one year later he went to heaven as well. I found God through my parents death. I know Dad wanted to be at my baptism but now him and Mom will have front row seats from heaven. Life is sure different without them but I know I will see them again one day. For now we just have to keep going.

Thank you to everyone here at Franconia for supporting us. There is a real sense of family here. I am ready to be baptized and continue attending church regularly.

If only they would have told us you really need to go to church but it certainly wasn't like them to tell us what to do. I know they are smiling down on us now and our proud of our efforts. How bittersweet it is that through their death we found God.

I'm excited to start this next chapter of our lives as we go through baptism and our faith continues to grow here at Franconia. Thank you to everyone for your support and prayers.

Marissa Anders—Baptism




