And we love increasing the excitement with secrets and mystery. We look forward to the day when those littles get to satisfy their longings as they open their gifts.

For us, the holidays don't look so magical. We've got lists to do a mile long, homes to decorate, gifts to buy, cookies to bake, all while keeping the holiday spirit in our hearts. How are we supposed to do that?

Jesus tells us in Matthew 18:3 that *unless (we) turn and become like children, (we) will never enter the kingdom of heaven*. Making Connections



Meet **Kelsy Weaver**.

Kelsy and I chatted in their family room as Alanna (2 1/2 years), and Isaiah (6 months) played beside us. Kelsy enjoys being a stay-at-home mom, and she also enjoys her part-time job in marketing at Bergey's Inc. where she uses her gifts in graphic design.

Kelsy, is the oldest of three children. She has two younger brothers, and they grew up in a log cabin on a mountain in Dillsburg, PA. Although their mile-long driveway had its challenges, Kelsy loved living in the house her dad built. Dillsburg, a small close-knit community, is a short distance from Harrisburg.

While there are similarities between where she lives now, and where she grew up, Kelsy notices two distinct differences. One, is that her home congregation, Slate Hill Mennonite, is the only Mennonite church in that area, and second, is the family connectedness. Similar family names are not the norm in her home community. Kelsy's extended family is scattered over the state of Pennsylvania, with their common thread being Messiah College, where her parents, grandparents, and many in her extended family graduated. Kelsy met Nate Weaver, her husband, at Messiah in their freshman year. Kelsy graduated in 2011 with a major in marketing and a minor in art.

Kelsy enjoys using her artistic talents with crafts, sewing projects, painting their home and other home improvement projects. She also enjoys knitting and being part of the prayer shawl ministry at Franconia.

A challenging time for Kelsy and Nate was on March 13, 2016, when she was 23 weeks and 4 days into her pregnancy with Alanna and her water broke. She clearly remembers it was a Sunday night when they rushed to Grand View Hospital's emergency room and were told she would be transferred to Lehigh Valley Hospital in Allentown via ambulance. The seriousness of their situation became evident to this young couple when Nate was told not to follow the ambulance, as they would be traveling very fast. [And for accountant husband, Nate, this was the middle of tax season!] At Lehigh Valley Hospital, Kelsy was put on magnesium, and told to prepare for an emergency C-section. She had Preterm Premature Rupture of Membranes. But by the next morning, her contractions had slowed down and there was enough amniotic fluid in her uterus to allow her to carry Alanna full term. After a few days of monitoring, she was sent home without restrictions. The membranes sealed over. However, she limited her activity to the bare essentials. This experience, Kelsy shares, is "our miracle." Reflecting back, they see how it drew them closer together as a couple, and, while it tested their faith, it drew them closer to God. (And as a side note, there were no issues with Isaiah's pregnancy.)

A favorite verse of Kelsy's is Philippians 4: 6-7: Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.
