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Making Connections

Meet **Shirley Hackman**. Shirley is a quiet, yet ever smiling presence amongst our people. I met with her and her stories confirmed my belief that stories need to be shared.

Shirley is the 2nd oldest of 4 children. Many of you knew her older sister, Dorothy Nice. Her younger sister, Elaine, passed away at the age of 10 months. She still has her younger brother, Ken. He is 12 years her junior. Ten years of age is young to lose a baby sister. But that was not the end of Shirley's losses. When she was 19, her

mother passed away. Dorothy was already married so Shirley became the homemaker and helped raise her younger brother. Her dad remarried years later, but he only lived for 2 years before cancer took him from his new wife and his family.

Shirley met and married Curtis Freed in 1969 when she was 35 years old. She knew that Curt would like to have children, but God didn't have that in mind for them. Shirley shared that she grieved being childless mostly for Curt. They were married for 16 years before Curt died from heart-related illnesses.

Stanley Hackman was a friend of Curt's. Stan had built his own business, "Hackman's Electric," and the building on Rt. 113 that we all know as Clemmer Music. Shirley remembers when Stan called her to tell of his wife's passing. She then called him when Curt passed away. In 1989, she married Stan and they shared 17 years together. Stan had 2 daughters from his first marriage and they loved and accepted Shirley into the family. But in later years, Stan suffered 2 heart attacks and 2 strokes and God took him home in 2006.

Now a widow for the 2nd time, plans for her future moved her to the Souderton Mennonite Home where she has



many friends, including a core group from Franconia! It was after this that she had 2 more losses: her dear sister, Dorothy, went home to Heaven in 2016, and then the PA turnpike expansion project took down the house she'd lived in for 46 years. (It had been Curt's house.)

But Shirley's spirit is not hardened by all this loss. She smiles as she shares that Stan has left her a very large family:

2 daughters, 9 grandchildren, 24 great-grandchildren, and 27 great great-grandchildren. And to Dorothy's grandchildren she is known as "Great Shirley" (because she is their great aunt)!

Just one month ago, Shirley underwent cataract surgery and had complications that brought the risk of losing her sight. Her activity was restricted for 1 month. She speaks of this time as very difficult and she felt alone. She has already suffered much loss, but now her vision? But peace flooded her heart as she leaned on her Lord and Savior, saying "I know You are here." Everything turned out fine and she is back up and out and doing ministry.

Yes, ministry! Shirley visits residents in Personal Care and Health Care at SMH. (They missed her during her month of recuperation!) And she has a special connection with other women who have also suffered recent losses of their own. She understands there are some parts of losing your spouse that you never get over. Shirley hasn't allowed these losses to define who she is, rather she focuses on the numerous blessings she has gained and out of her loss, she lovingly ministers to others.
