A PASTORAL WORD

At the end of this grinding, contentious, and isolating year, these words of Scripture ring with godly wisdom: "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition -- with thanksgiving -- present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Phil 4:4-7)

I have often been reminded this year of how the Israelites were tested in the wilderness. There was lots to complain about. But God always provided enough. How are we responding to the testing of 2020? There is lots to complain about; I've done my share.

The Apostle Paul, however, recommends a response to hardship that displays deep spiritual maturity: Rejoicing in the Lord; being gentle with each other; trusting and thanking God; receiving peace in Christ Jesus. Nursery, so parents must remain with their children during their time there.




From the Leadership Team


