

Give Careful Thought By Julie Kratz

The repeated phrase, "Give careful thought," stuck out to me as I read the book of Haggai in the Old Testament. After being in exile, some of the Jews had returned to their homes and begun rebuilding their former lives. But when they started to rebuild the temple, they faced opposition and were ordered to stop, so they gave up the project. Years passed and they continued to build their homes and make their lives comfortable once more, but they did not attempt to work on the temple anymore.

Then God sent the prophet Haggai to them. He said, "Give careful thought to your ways" (1:5,7) Is it right that you are living in comfort, spending all your time attending to your own wants and needs, while God's temple is neglected? (1:4) He urged them to consider whether this was pleasing to God, and told them that God wanted them to rebuild his temple so that he would be honored (1:8). Haggai didn't give any room for the argument that they had been ordered to stop building, or that they were facing opposition. He told them they needed to do what was right in God's sight, no matter what people might say or do. They had chosen comfort and security over honoring God, but Haggai pointed out that the land was not producing crops for them because God was not pleased with them. True comfort and security come from honoring God.

The people responded by obeying the voice of the Lord because they feared him (1:12), and God encouraged them to be strong and work their hardest because his Spirit was with them just as it had been so many years earlier when he led them out of Egypt. God also promised that he would bless them (2:19) and grant them peace (2:9).

Again and again Haggai urged the people to carefully consider if the way they were living was pleasing to God. What about us? Are we giving careful thought to our ways? Are there areas in our lives where we are living in comfort and neglecting to honor God? Are there things we know we should do to honor God, but we allow the fear of what others might think or do keep us from them? Do we recognize that striving to do well in the world's eyes does not result in the peace and security we hope for, and that only obedience to Holy God will lead to future blessing?

Together, let's challenge ourselves this month to give careful thought to the way we live and the decisions we make. And as we seek to obediently honor God, let's look forward to him blessing us with his peace!
