Valentine's day is a celebration of friendship as well as the romantic love highlighted in *Making Connections*. Friendship is an important component of romantic love. I cherish friends who note good, in the midst of obvious faults. Like those who lavishly praised the zinnias in our flower bed, and didn't mention the decaying wood supporting the porch screens behind them. Susan Lenzkes describes these friends as: "*dear ones who pad barefoot through the soul.*" Such persons allow us to be ourselves and let our guard down. With these we can breathe freely. However, of those who highlight flaws & mistakes, she describes: "*tromping in with work boots...good intentions...and spiked heels of advice and pat answers.*" [[A Silver Pen for Cloudy Days](#)] This doesn't feel so good. I like the reminder Dorothy Ferguson, in her poem, "If We Knew Each Other Better," offers:

*If we knew each other better
In each circumstance we'd see
That in the same predicament
No different might we be.*

Yet there is time for truth. Our contractor needed to tell us the extent of damage to the boards supporting our porch. Those boards did need to be removed and replaced. John 1:14 describes Jesus as embodying grace and truth. Pastor Gary Wilkerson highlights the entire verse: "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth," and writes, "*Grace and truth are contained within Christ's glory...they proceed from it. ...Our lives are meant to express Jesus in all his glory, and that requires his transformation of us.*" When I recognize a quickness within me to see, or note change I think others need to make, this reveals a need to humbly recognize my own "broken fences," and my own need for grace.

As our transformation evolves, I believe the last stanza of Dorothy Ferguson's poem occurs:

*"What joy it always brings to you
When someone clasps your hand,
And softly whispers with a smile,
"Dear friend, I understand."*

Prayer: Dear Lord Jesus, with the power of the Holy Spirit living within us, please continue transforming us, so we reflect Your glory and love like You. Full of grace and truth.

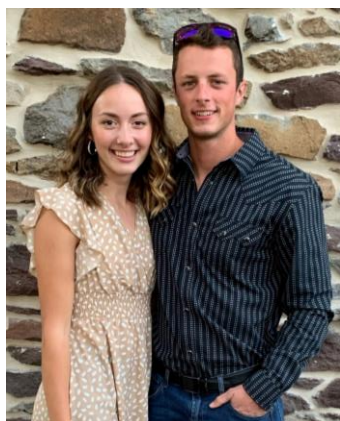

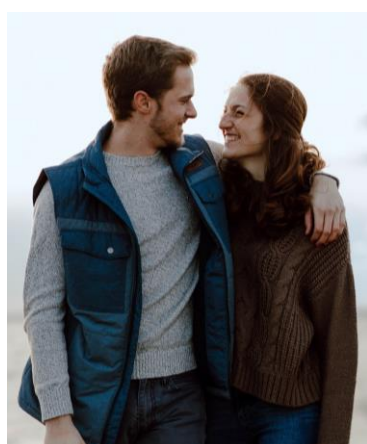
Meet our Brides!

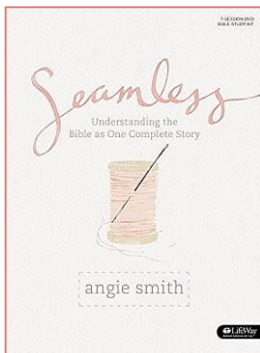
