

Contagious Faith by Carol Landis

"<u>When they saw the courage</u> of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men...they took note that these men <u>had been with Jesus</u>" (Acts 4:13).

Her eyes were closed; tears were sliding down her checks, yet her face was serene as she sang: "For Jesus has risen and we shall not die!" This scene, still etched in my mind decades later, took place during my friend's funeral. The woman singing was his mother. Yes, there were tears but I was sure the words she was singing expressed deep and sincere beliefs. As a teen in the 1970's era, I was well aware of hypocrisy within the Christian church, yet also realized God's children could never be perfect. I couldn't put it all together, but I believed Greg's parents had the "real" thing. I wanted that kind of faith.

The evening following Greg's accident his parents invited his high school friends to stop by their house. Death had created a void so dark and huge that although prior to his death few of us had any personal interaction with them, we went. Tears flowed as we loved on each other. To be "held" in community, and witness genuine faith in the midst of overwhelming grief was life-changing. As our visits continued, the strength and peace of these two people was contagious.

Who am I? What do my responses show? In daily "blimps" or full-blown crisis, can those around me see I've been with Jesus? Living in the midst of a door closing (Jesus' death), an unfathomable miracle (Jesus' resurrection), and witnessing another unexplainable occurrence (Jesus' accession), the actions of Jesus' disciples in Acts 1 are a lesson in living out one's faith.

They all joined together (v. 14). When fear and doubt dominate, as Pastor Josh shared Easter Sunday, we need to be intentional to physically place ourselves within a community of faith.

They <u>prayed constantly</u> (v.14). Corporately; privately. While living in deep sadness, continuously talking to God ignites trust and hope.

They <u>recognized and acted on what was needed next</u> (vs.21-26). Grief and disappointment can cause us to act in ways that are not helpful or paralyze us. God leads us to wise next steps.

<u>The Holy Spirit arrives</u> (Acts 2:4). When God's Spirit "shows up," and we experience the power of His Spirit, feelings of devastation lose their power. An eternal perspective develops, and we receive strength through the Holy Spirit. And God's strength flowing through us is contagious.

Lord Jesus, in every "blimp" or crisis, please help me ask, and depend on, the powerful presence of Your Spirit. Amen.
