

Unanswered Prayer by Carol Landis

"Why do you say...and complain... 'My way is hidden from the LORD; my cause is disregarded by my God?'" -Isaiah 40:27

The stories are varied, but the disappointment, weariness, and pain are the same. Often included is the struggle to trust. And I hurt. A hurt that clings long after my ear has heard and my heart has sympathized. For I too, have known this pain. For me, the simple solution of surrender and trust, or hopeless commiserating, hasn't been helpful.

Recently, reading Matthew 7, these words of Jesus stood out to me. "If you, then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts...how much more will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask him!" (v.7). I also noted Luke 11:13, adds the phrase, "how much more will our Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him." To have confident trust in God's goodness and faithfulness, and depend on the power of His Spirit to bring change, while living in the midst of God's silence, or what seems like inaction, is taking God at His Word. Yet, when nothing changes, how does one do so?

I feel reminded of the quote, "you cannot keep birds from flying over your head, but you can keep them from building a nest in your hair" (Martin Luther). I believe the following truths, and others like these, are what needs to "nest."

- ~ My Savior understands disappointment, betrayal, pain, death (Mark 14&15).
- ~ Jesus loves, knows, and cares for me (Rom. 8:37&38; John 10:14; 1 Peter 5:7).
- ~ God's ways are eternal. (Rev. 1:8; Isa. 55:8&9).
- ~ God wants to walk with me (Isa. 43:2, Matt. 28:10)
- ~ God is able to do more than I can ask or imagine (Eph. 3:20)

These cause me to remember times I've experienced the faithfulness of God. Times I've known peace when nothing changed (and situations grew worse), when He provided for my heart; times I was awed by the power of God to change my circumstances, or me.

"Do you not know? ... The LORD...the everlasting God...will not grow tired or weary...his understanding no one can fathom. He gives strength to the weary... increases the power of the weak. ...those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength. They will soar...run...walk and not be faint" (Isa. 40:28,29,31, NIV).

Dear Lord, when waiting, we easily become weary. With Your Spirit, please strengthen us, so we can hold onto the hope of who You are, and in what You do. Amen.


