If you were to tell me that on a cold, January day you wrapped yourself in a big blanket to get warm, I could picture that and relate. The Lord and His angels have appeared as light to people in the Bible several times. In December, we read in the account of Jesus' birth how the glory of the Lord shone around the angel who appeared to the shepherds. Jesus appeared to Saul while he was on his way to Damascus with his intent to take Christian men and women and put them in prison in Jerusalem. Jesus appeared as a light from heaven that flashed around him as recorded in Acts 9:3. Saul's response was to fall to the ground.

Isaiah 60:19-20 connects with the Lord as our Light. It says "The sun will no more be your light by day, nor will the brightness of the moon shine on you, for the Lord will be your everlasting light, and your God will be your glory. Your sun will never set again, and your moon will wane no more; the Lord will be your everlasting light, and your days of sorrow will end." These verses from Isaiah who was a prophet, placed in the Bible between Genesis and Revelation which teach of the Lord as our light, help make the story complete in my mind of who the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are. It is beautiful that Isaiah includes his statement that our days of sorrow will end. That will come at the right time in God's plan. Those are the words of the voice from heaven that John heard and wrote about in Revelation...that God will be with believers in Christ, living with us, and He will wipe every tear from the eyes of those who believe in Him.

This time of year, I miss the early sunrise and late sunset, so I am dependent on other forms of light. I appreciate the soft, warm light from the string lights set up for Christmas in our home, and I like leaving them up in the dark months of winter...lingering in the beauty of their light in the early mornings and evenings that are dark.

In this month of the new year, as you admire and rely on lights, may you also think of Jesus who said "I am the Light of the World". Wrap yourself in a blanket on a January day, and speak to God of how much you love His light that wants to go before you every day, shining light on the tasks of your day and your attitudes as you go about doing them.
