

## By This All Will Know by Carol Landis

I'm watching the birds eating at our small feeder. Hearing their soft chirps through the window brings a smile. Two beautiful bluebirds munch together with a tiny sparrow...now another sparrow joins them. It's quite a different scenario from last winter when two blue jays each fought to claim the feeder. They exemplified, "if you keep on biting and devouring each other, watch out or you will be destroyed by each other" (Gal. 5:15). They chased each other around the branches above the feeder so neither could eat. Although more than enough room for both, they couldn't perch on either side and eat together. Who am I? I'd like to be a blue bird, or even a sparrow, but when am I more like those blue jays?

Recently I attempted to memorize the thirteen verses of 1 Corinthians 13. Can't say I accomplished that goal, but after focusing on these verses, I find their message continuing to challenge me to look for, and practice, them in daily life. Several examples come to mind: a host, a friend, loving parents. A host we barely knew, joyfully hosted 7 of us. Lavishly preparing delightful meals, fresh bedding, even a birthday cake, yet tells me she doesn't remember that I wasn't feeling well, and went to bed without offering to help in any way. And she invited us back again. Love is kind...is not easily angered (v.4,5). A friend I hurt by my words and actions. I apologized afterwards, but the damage was done. Yet she gave me the gift of forgiveness and grace. I savor the restored friendship; the forgiveness; the grace. Love keeps no record of wrongs (v.5). The love of parents for their disabled child; moving to a new home to accommodate changing needs; valuing and including the child as much as possible in activities and outings. Love is not self-seeking; love always protects; always perseveres (vv.5,6). Such love embodies the grace we each need.

Am I a blue jay creating havoc by biting and devouring? Or like the sparrows, black chickadees, and finches now sharing the feeder outside my window? Do I recognize each person as created in God's image? Is the visual I leave: "by this all...will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (John 13:35)?

Love embodies the grace we each need.

Lord, with the power of Your Spirit within me, enable me to love as You love me.






### Women's Spring Bible Study
