I found myself struggling with whether or not to go ahead with writing about a portion of the sermon on the mount since this has been our current sermon series. I wondered if it would seem over the top or maybe it would seem like I wasn't very original in thinking of new subject matter. I have been amazed at how many different ways the Lord has been bringing Matthew 7:24-27 to mind in the past few months, and I realized that maybe reading this could be how God reminds you of the weight of this passage. I was encouraged by friends of mine who recently chose this section from Jesus's sermon as the scripture to be read in their wedding ceremony. They were acknowledging the weight of entering into a covenant before God. Jesus doesn't simply say the house with the foundation of sand would fall but that great was the fall of it. There is an intensity to this passage that can often be missed when we are used to hearing this verse's message in the form of a children's song. We must go deeper and evaluate the strength of our spiritual life's foundation. If it is weak, maybe you feel ill-equipped to strengthen it on your own. You aren't alone if that is you! We need accountability, church leadership, and most importantly a life marked by time in prayer and study of scripture. These things are purposeful gifts given to us by a loving Father. Don't assume because your desires shift that your foundation will immediately firm up and that your walk with the Lord will be closer. We must put in the work and be doers of the word!

"And those who belong to Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit." Galatians 5:24-25

Lord, I come before you with a thankful heart for giving us Your word in written form. We can ask for wisdom and You give it. Your word is clear that when we hear Your teachings and do them, we will be like the wise man who built his house on the rock. I pray that we all would be granted strength and courage to crucify our flesh daily and walk in step with You. Amen
